



COVID POLICY

Preamble

The Queensland Government has removed from all but a small number of high risk venues the requirement to implement special measures to control the spread of Covid infection. In particular, it no longer has a general requirement for businesses and organisations to check for proof of vaccination and for face masks to be worn.

The QBA has advised that that proof of double vaccination and the wearing of masks will no longer be mandated for events held under the auspices of the ABF or the QBA.

The Covid virus continues to be active across the Queensland community, with almost 5,000 new cases reported each day (as at June 2022).

Health authorities acknowledge that vaccination is the best protection against infection by the virus. The Government has strongly encouraged all Queenslanders to become vaccinated and has provided ready access to the vaccine. Over 90% of eligible Queenslanders have been vaccinated.

Policy

Members are strongly urged to become vaccinated.

Intending players are asked to observe normal good health practice.

Players are asked not to attend any event if they are not well, and definitely not if they are supposed to be isolating or quarantining.

Intending players will not be required to provide proof of vaccination.

Intending players who show Covid-like symptoms, will be asked to leave.

The wearing of face masks is optional.
