Sizzling Summer of Bridge

KBC – A Good Club and a Strong Club. Exactly two years ago this was the headline that opened the KBC Newsletter. Events of the last month provided some key indicators of this claim. The month of January saw a range of competitions located at places such as Orange, QCBC, Toowoomba, Northern Suburbs and ended with our own KBC Congress held at Toowong Bridge Club. It was so heartening to see club members of varying ranks competing and earning Gold and Red masterpoints at all these events (see page 3).

The KBC Graded Pairs and Teams Congress was over-subscribed with 83 pairs and 42 teams from several regions competing. KBC Congress is always popular and this year it proved to be a success on many counts. Convenor, George O'Brien and Director, Chris Snook ensured the event was efficient and well-run. Facilities at Toowong club were excellent and very much appreciated. (See page 2 for Winners - Photographs posted on the website and clubhouse noticeboards.) Several KBC rookie Pairs managed to go "up the ladder" to finish well in C Grade. This is testament to the KBC's Beginner Classes and the Supervised Play programs.

Beyond the club, Therese Tully for many years has encouraged rookie players to test their skills at the Gold Coast Congress. This is a great way to become acquainted with congress play and is an opportunity to earn gold points. Usually, KBC is well represented.

Even though the majority of our membership fits in the Rookie or Novice ranks, the percentages in all ranks are creeping up to higher levels. This is due in no small measure to the efforts of the KBC Education Team. Starting again at the end of February is another five-week series in the excellent Partnership and Development Program (see more on page 3).

There is ample evidence that we have a Good Club but signs of members wishing to improve their play, advance their skills, progress through the masterpoints rankings and compete in congresses are all signs that KBC is also a Strong Club and getting stronger.

Runners up were Margaret Mobbs and Diane McClintock (2) 1.23mps and in 3rd place were Mick Fawcett and Jill Dunning (3) 1.30mps. Congratulations to all participants.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING REPORT – Tuesday 13 February 2024

- **President's Report** dealt with the Kenmore Community Centre site development and described continuing frustrations re inability to access preliminary site plans despite assistance from Councillor Ademann. MP Elizabeth Watson-Brown has sought information through the mayor's office about the planning process.
- Vice President's Report drew attention to two grants for possible funding. Committee decided
 that neither was suitable and in present uncertain circumstances there is no pressing need. Some
 discussion led to decision to investigate options including installation of a free-standing water
 cooler, "plumbed in" water bubbler, handbag hooks.
- Treasurer's Report presented three factors to be considered in reinvesting two term deposits due
 to mature in February: (i) bank guarantee of funds (ii) interest rates and (iii) ease of management
 while requiring flexibility in case funds are required. Committee decided to combine the two
 investments currently held with BOQ and reinvest in one term deposit with Westpac.
 Disbursements document reviewed and approved.
- **Membership & Masterpoints Reports** 40 members to be contacted shortly regarding subscription renewal. Six new members since December. Noted increase in club session attendances.
- Congress Report (i) KBC Congress was a resounding success. Congratulations to GOB for the huge organisation involved and to all the caterers especially Trish Sheehan, Anne Munro, Marion Tomes and Elizabeth Handley; (ii) the KBC Pairs Championship review timing and specify that this event is designed for regular KBC players; (iii) GNOT considerations for initial planning.
- Facilities Report mouldy smell in middle room GOB to arrange for ceiling inspection and DD to contact Council re remedial action. Handsets DD to check batteries and rotate handset boxes.
- Communications, Social Events & Community Engagement Report: A5 glossy flyer for the membership drive printed; KK to contact Ed QLD re requirements of hosting bridge as a school sport option; sub-committee for wall-hangings to reconvene in March.
- **Secretary & Technology Report** AG to organise a G-Drive workshop for a later meeting; GOB to set up meeting for web-site review after GCC.
- Education Report Partnership and Development program set to recommence 26 February.
- decided to offer no cost social bridge while most Directors are away during the Gold Coast International Congress 17-24 February.

REFRESHER re MASTERPOINTS

(extract from ABF Starters' Kit)

Masterpoints come in three colours.

- 1. Wins at club sessions will gain **green** masterpoints (how many depends on the size of the field).
- 2. Placing in competitions and congresses run by your club and other clubs will gain **red** master-points. (Each club is allocated a certain number of red point sessions per year.
- 3. National events and club events such as GNOT will attract gold masterpoints.

Information about the number of masterpoints you will need to work your way up the rankings, together with the colour/s required, is provided on the back of your ABF Registration Card and the "ABF Rankings Certificates".

Currently, only a small proportion of regular club players compete in bridge congresses, which is where you start to accrue red and gold points. This is a shame because these events provide members with a huge opportunity to build on their ranking whilst at the same time deriving a lot of enjoyment from their sport. (more on why Congress Bridge is different in another issue)

Once you have a taste of competitive bridge playing, you will quickly gain confidence in the competition process and move quickly through your ABF rankings.
