## REPORT OF COMMITTEE MEETING – Tuesday 14 December

The Committee:

- received the Treasurer's report and noted that all transactions are up to date and the club's finances are in a healthy state
- perused floor plans and discussed traffic movements for delegates during the January Congress and clarified roles and operations over the course of the two days
- noted that membership stands at 382 and that renewal notices were sent out on 29 November
- inspected proposals for refurbishing the outdoor area and authorised DD & JB to purchase
- received an update on the development of process charts for the management of 1. Treasury and 2. Training responsibilities within the club
- noted the success of 2022 Christmas party and that with the additional funds from the raffle yielded a profit sufficient to fund prizes for the Congress raffles
- determined that the 2023 Kenmore-Roma-Dalby Interchange be held on the weekend of 26 August 2023
- commissioned AG to order sample polo shirts so that decisions can be made as to the possibility of making club shirts available for purchase
- considered ways in which security of club protocols and communication could be strengthened
- responded to a letter from Andrew Sharp re the "competitive DNA within the club".
