MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING REPORT – Tuesday 21 November 2023

At the meeting that was 10 minutes short of 4 hours, apart from procedural matters, Committee:

- Resolved to conduct a membership drive: KK to draft, for 4069 postcodes, a message which AG
 will repeat for 4070. Also, KK to prepare a flyer that is to be distributed in local area Real Estate
 starter kits
- Clarified and confirmed **Membership Rates** as \$65 home/ \$55 concession/ \$26 away/ \$20 away concession with a half-year rate being charged from October to December.
- Perused the completed **calendar for 2024.** GOB to write a process guide for those constructing club calendars in future years.
- Approved the **Treasurer's reports**. One extra credit card requested for providores. SC to clarify limits on all transaction accounts.
- Conducted further planning for **KBC January Congress** including formation of a Catering Team (GOB to organise) and conducting raffles towards expenses (KK to organise).
- Agreed to the quoted **expenses for WIX website** as \$15 per month under current use and between \$600 and \$1000 for the site development to replace current website one with easier layout and editing options.
- Requested AG to (i) provide a workshop on using **G-Drive** for the committee by using the club's internal screens to facilitate and (ii) review the folder structure in G-Drive.
- Appointed EH as **Club Recorder**. GOB to investigate scope of recorder's responsibilities.
- Discussed Bridge-mates in terms of the issue of making results available after the play of each board. KK to prepare a short survey listing "pros and cons" to be conducted at the club over all sessions for one week.
- Responded to complaints regarding **noise during play**. DD to ask directors to address this issue at each session and remind players to move tables only once directed.
- Authorised DD to purchase **additional drinking glasses** and water jugs.
- Agreed to a review of clubhouse artwork. KK to lead a small sub-committee with LN and JI. AR
 agreed to provide appropriate photography.
