Table Talk

In the latest ABF Newsletter (November 2016 p.21) Kim Frazer reminds us of Bridge Etiquette involving Table Talk. This is particularly relevant in Kenmore Bridge Club's particularly crowded Bridge playing rooms as we sit cheek by jowl almost in the lap of players at the next table. When overhearing a post-mortem discussion, it should be reported to the director. The result is the board will not be played at your table - an enormous disadvantage as you cannot bid, play and win that board which may cost you winning an event.

"Sometimes" says Kim, "it is not even a conversation about why the pair failed to get to the right contract, but the entry of the scores in the Bridgemate which causes the problem. Player A says loudly "so that was 6H by north making 13, or Player B says "What was the score there? 4S one off?" GRRRRRR....."

Discussion about hands at the table is:

- Against the rules of bridge;
- Slows play (not so many boards played in a session)
- It damages other players when boards are cancelled due to an overheard conversation.
- Unreported conversations may be used to advantage and this is direct cheating.

Because bridge is played in a quiet environment, conversations can be easily overheard. On your personal record sheet make a note of boards you want to discuss with your partner and take time at the end of the day to go over those hands with your partner.
