Welcome to the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting of the fastest-growing bridge club in Australia.

Today I'd like to acknowledge a year of achievements and offer a glimpse at our future, which is looking very bright. With over 400 players, Kenmore Bridge Club is a not-forprofit, volunteer organisation with a strong commitment to growing the bridge community in the West.

To keep our members up to-date, we created a club news-letter "Kenmore Gum Leaf" edited by Leanne Nugent, available online or at the club.


#### There's been a lot to report on!

We've initiated events and together with partners, including QBA, ABF and Australia Bridge Magazine we have participated in many events including Queensland Wide Pairs, Saturday Nationwide Pairs and Novice event sessions. Our signature Australia Day Weekend congress was a sell-out. KBC members then joined 2400 players from around Australia and overseas at the prestigious Gold Coast Congress. We were officially recognised as the club with the most players in the Rookie and under 50 masterpoint events. We had strong representation at the QBA's Teams of 3 in the Rookie and Novice levels.

We love introducing new people to the game of bridge, with regular training sessions for beginners by Tim Runting and myself. Supervised sessions run by Theresa Tully, Richard Wallis, Tim Runting and myself and Intermediate level lessons with Andy Hung. Workshops by Andy and Alex Smirnov, who is ranked 34<sup>th</sup> in the world, were also hosted for players wanting to improve their bridge playing skills.

Since the club was formed, KBC has joined other clubs in being a keen supporter of NeuRA (Neuroscience Research Australia) that leads research into aging and neurodegenerative diseases such as Alzheimer's and Parkinson's. Our members raised \$540 for this worthy cause in the Australia-wide Bridge for Brains Research Challenge session in May.

As for our own fundraising, we've attracted another grant from the Community Gambling Benefit Fund for much-needed permanent furniture. Thanks to committee member, Sue Cheney. Reduced borrowing from QBA required!

The success of our much-loved club means that it is rapidly outgrowing the Community Centre and, as you know, we've been seeking a new venue for the past 3 years. A year ago, Cr Margaret De Wit advised KBC that after a thorough evaluation of local buildings and appropriate sites in the near Kenmore area, Brisbane City Council recommended that there was only one suitable site, and that would require a new building at 43 Pullenvale Road. Encouraged by the Brisbane City Council, we lodged a Development Application for a community clubhouse. Thanks to Kathy Males for her project management and persistence in maintaining the momentum amongst all the diverse groups involved. The club has addressed objections and are hopeful that the DA will be approved.

KBC is aiming to raise \$400,000 deposit of the total clubhouse cost. This is to be more than matched by grant funding from organisations and government. We are currently managing a KBC cash reserve of over \$100,000. KBC members have personally pledged almost \$70,000 to date, for which we thank them. We do have access to low interest loans from QBA and ABF if there is any shortfall. We will only invoke the member pledges when all grant funding is in place. In accordance with DA approval, KBC will have 4 years to complete the community clubhouse.

- ♦ A careless or incomplete claim may cost you tricks that you would otherwise make.
- ♦ Claims should be made where possible it is discourteous to continue play when the outcome is certain.
