Finishing after noon makes it difficult for the change-over as the arriving afternoon players find it a challenge to park. Players have requested mini-lessons on conventions they are ready to add to their playing strategies. From the beginning of September, Graham will do a mini-lesson each Tuesday starting at 8.30. Also, later in the year Andy Hung will offer lessons specifically designed for Super Novice players.

Andy Hung again ran an enormously informative series of classes for Rookie and Intermediate players. His lessons are extremely valuable for all players to learn and revisit to better understand playing the challenging game of bridge.

Ron Klinger presented an informative and entertaining workshop. It was held in the BCC Kenmore Library as our facility is not conducive to large group teaching. Many thanks to Andrew Sharp, Peter Allingham, Jill Dunning, Sue Noble, Mick Fawcett and Susan Sharp for fetching, carrying, set-up and pull down and re-set in club rooms – tedious tasks, yet well worth the effort for those members who attended.

In Queensland, this prize goes to the top two Queensland pairs in the restricted competition at the Gold Coast Congress. This year, Lyn Tracey and I were the lucky winners, as well as Winny Chan and Aijun Yang from Toowong Bridge Club.

The pairs competition was over the weekend of 4th and 5th August where Lyn and I had a great start to be at table one for most of the day but the next day we had too many draws which dropped us to 8th place.
